### MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The following Management's Discussion and Analysis ("MD&A") of the operating results and financial condition of United Corporations Limited ("United" or the "Company") for the second quarter of fiscal 2016 should be read in conjunction with: the March 31, 2015 Annual Report, including the MD&A, the Company's audited annual financial statements and the notes and supplementary financial information; the Company's MD&A and unaudited interim condensed financial statements and notes for the previous quarter of fiscal 2016; and the unaudited quarterly condensed financial statements and notes contained in this report. These unaudited interim condensed financial statements have been prepared in compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"), which is generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP"), as set out in the Handbook of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada. The reporting currency for the Company is the Canadian dollar, and all amounts in the following discussion are in Canadian dollars.

This MD&A may contain certain forward-looking statements that are subject to risks and uncertainties that may cause the results or events mentioned in this discussion to differ materially from actual results or events. No assurance can be given that results, performance or achievement expressed in, or implied by, any forward-looking statements within this disclosure will occur, or if they do, that any benefits may be derived from them.

### The Company

United is a closed-end investment corporation that trades on the Toronto Stock Exchange. United is an investment vehicle for long-term growth through investments in common equities, as management believes that over long periods of time, common equities, as an asset class, will outperform fixed-income instruments or balanced funds. From time to time, however, assets of the Company may be invested in interest-bearing short-term securities pending the selection of suitable equity investments.

The Company has been a closed-end investment corporation since 1929 and has never bought back its Common Shares. The Common Shares have historically traded at a discount to their net asset value, ranging from as high as a 45% discount to as low as a 20% discount. Management believes that shareholders who have invested in the Common Shares of the Company recognize that the Common Shares of the Company usually trade at a discount to their net asset value.

Closed-end funds have the following benefits: they often allow investors the opportunity to purchase assets at a discounted price; they have management expense ratios which are generally much lower than those for openended funds; and the management of a closed-end fund's portfolio is not impacted by shareholder subscription or redemption activities.

United has no plans to become an open-ended investment fund.

The external investment portfolio of the Company is actively managed by Jarislowsky Fraser Limited ("Jarislowsky") and ValueInvest Asset Management S.A. ("ValueInvest"). Each of the managers has a global equity mandate. As of September 30, 2015, \$665,624,000 and \$733,340,000 of investments were managed by Jarislowsky and ValueInvest, respectively.

The Company has a long-term investment in Algoma Central Corporation ("Algoma"). Algoma and United are related parties. In management's view, the investment in Algoma is consistent with the Company's investment strategy and contributes to achieving the investment objective of the Company. Further related party information is provided in Note 12 to the financial statements in the 2015 Annual Report and in the schedule of investment portfolio in this interim report beginning on page 14.

### **Investment Strategy**

The objective of the Company is to earn an above-average rate of return, primarily through long-term capital appreciation and dividend income. Short-term volatility is expected and tolerated. Management remains confident that the Company's investment strategy will reward shareholders over the long-term.

The investment portfolio of the Company comprises a mix of predominantly foreign equities. Net equity value and net investment income may vary significantly from period to period depending on the economic environment and market conditions.

### MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

### **Use of Non-GAAP Measures**

This MD&A contains references to "net equity value per Common Share" and "net investment income per Common Share". These terms do not have any standardized meaning in GAAP and therefore may not be comparable to similar measures presented by other companies. The Company believes that these measures provide information useful to our shareholders in evaluating the Company's financial results.

Net equity value per Common Share is used by investors and management as a comparison to the market price of its Common Shares to determine the discount or premium at which the Company's Common Shares are trading. In order to determine its net equity value per Common Share, the Company deducts the cost of redemption of its Preferred Shares from its net assets.

Net investment income per Common Share is used by both investors and management to assess the approximate amount of dividends to be distributed on Common Shares. In order to determine its net investment income per Common Share, the Company deducts the dividends paid on its Preferred Shares.

### MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

### Net Equity Value per Common Share

For the quarter ended September 30, 2015, the Company's net equity value per Common Share increased to \$116.18 from \$115.28 at June 30, 2015. With dividends reinvested at month-end net equity values, the Company's net equity value return was 1.0% in fiscal 2016 compared to a return of 1.3% for the same period in the prior fiscal year. On a fiscal year-to-date basis, the net equity value per Common Share decreased to \$116.18 from \$117.86 at March 31, 2015. The net equity value return for the fiscal year to date was negative 0.2% compared to a return of 2.1% in the prior fiscal period.

As the Company is a taxable Canadian corporation, the Company's net equity value is net of a provision for income taxes on net investment income and net realized gains (losses) on investments, and net of a deferred income tax provision on its change in fair value of investments.

### MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

### **Operating Results**

### Net income

The Company's net income in the second quarter of fiscal 2016 decreased to \$13,398,000 from \$15,840,000 for the second quarter of fiscal 2015. On a year-to-date basis, there was a net loss of \$3,281,000 compared to net income of \$25,895,000 in fiscal 2015. Net income per Common Share for the second quarter of fiscal 2016 decreased to \$1.09 compared to \$1.29 for the same period in fiscal 2015. On a year-to-date basis there was a net loss per share of \$0.28 compared to net income per share of \$2.11 in fiscal 2015.

For the second quarter of fiscal 2016 the fair value change in investments was a fair value gain of \$8,441,000 compared to \$14,023,000 for the same period in fiscal 2015. During the second quarter of fiscal 2016, the fair value gains of investments in North America and Europe of \$24,232,000 were partially offset by fair value losses of \$15,791,000 for investments in United Kingdom, Asia, South America and Australia.

On a year-to-date basis the fair value change in investments was a loss of \$23,465,000 compared to a gain of \$13,975,000 for the six months ended September 30, 2014. Fair value gains in North America of \$11,356,000 were offset by investment losses in Europe of \$16,865,000, United Kingdom \$2,096,000, Asia \$9,215,000, Australia \$3,808,000 and South America \$2,837,000.

The net realized gain was \$33,347,000 for the second quarter of fiscal 2016 compared to \$11,032,000 for the same period in the prior year, an increase of \$22,315,000. On a year-to-date basis, the net realized gain was \$49,592,000 compared to a net realized gain of \$23,936,000 for fiscal 2015. The largest year-to-date contributors to the net realized gain during fiscal 2016 were the sales of Time Warner Cable Inc., ConAgra Foods Inc., Kraft Foods Inc., Mondelez International Inc. and Toyota Motor Corporation.

### Net investment income

The Company's net investment income in the second quarter of fiscal 2016 increased to \$6,075,000 compared to \$3,675,000 for the second quarter of fiscal 2015. On a year-to-date basis, net investment income increased to \$17,075,000 from \$13,767,000 for the same period in the prior year, an increase of 24%. On a per Common Share basis, net investment income for the quarter increased to \$0.49 in 2016 compared to \$0.29 in 2015 and on a year-to-date basis increased to \$1.38 in 2016 compared to \$1.11 in 2015.

Foreign dividend income in the second quarter increased to \$9,710,000 from \$6,140,000 for the same quarter in the prior year and on year-to-date basis increased by 25% to \$26,105,000 from \$20,890,000 in fiscal 2015. The increase occurred primarily as a result of growth in the average global investment portfolio along with the impact of foreign exchange including the rise of the US dollar.

Interest and securities lending income decreased to \$145,000 for the second quarter of the year compared to \$148,000 for the same quarter in the prior year, and on a year-to-date basis decreased to \$343,000 compared to \$461,000 in the prior year.

Expenses during the quarter increased to \$1,921,000 in fiscal 2016 compared to \$1,633,000 for the same period in the prior year, and on a year-to-date basis increased to \$3,894,000 compared to \$3,311,000 in the prior year. The majority of the increase in both periods relates primarily to an increase in investment management and administrative costs resulting from a higher average investment portfolio compared to the prior year.

Investment income is derived primarily from dividend income that is earned by the Company. While North American investments usually pay regular quarterly dividends, investments outside of North America often pay less frequently. In general, dividends earned on investments outside of North America peak in the first quarter of the fiscal year. There is no guarantee that the Company will receive dividend income on its investments at current dividend payout levels.

Overall returns are determined by the performance of the investment managers of the portfolio and may fluctuate significantly as illustrated by the past eight quarters. The returns generated by the investment managers may not correlate with benchmark returns.

### Share Data

As at September 30, 2015, the following shares were issued and outstanding: 52,237 First Preferred Shares, 80,290 1959 Series Second Preferred Shares, 119,710 1963 Series Second Preferred Shares, and 12,194,193 Common Shares.

### Liquidity and Capital Resources

Quarterly dividends were paid on the Common Shares and Preferred Shares. The quarterly per share dividend was \$0.20 on the Common Shares and \$0.375 for each Preferred Share series. Payment of the Company's dividends is funded by net investment income. The Company also paid an additional \$1.00 (2015 - \$0.73) per Common Share dividend representing a distribution of the balance of net investment income for the prior fiscal year after payment of Preferred Share and quarterly Common Share dividends.

The Company's dividend policy is to distribute annual net investment income, after payment of Preferred Share dividends. Common Share dividends of \$0.20 are paid quarterly. Annual net investment income in excess of quarterly dividends is distributed in the first quarter following the fiscal year. The Company's dividend policy is established by the Board of Directors at its discretion and is subject to change.

### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### (Unaudited)

### 1. Description of Company and summary of operations

United Corporations Limited ("United" or the "Company") is a closed-end investment corporation. The head office, principal address and registered office of the Company is located at 165 University Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, M5H 3B8.

United trades on the Toronto Stock Exchange under the symbols UNC, UNC PR.A., UNC PR.B. and UNC PR.C. United is an investment vehicle for long-term growth through investments in common equities, as management believes that over long periods of time, common equities, as an asset class, will outperform fixed-income instruments or balanced funds. From time to time, however, assets of the Company may be invested in interest-bearing short-term securities pending the selection of suitable equity investments.

The interim condensed financial statements are presented in Canadian dollars which is the functional and presentation currency. These interim condensed financial statements were approved by the Company's Board of Directors on November 2, 2015.

### 2. Basis of presentation

These unaudited interim condensed financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard ("IAS") 34 - Interim Financial Reporting as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board and follow the same accounting policies and methods as the most recent annual financial statements. These unaudited interim condensed financial statements do not include all of the disclosures required under International Financial Reporting Standards for annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the notes to the Company's audited financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2015.

### 3. Critical accounting estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statements requires management to use judgment in applying its accounting policies and to make estimates and assumptions about the future. The following discusses the most significant accounting judgments and estimates that the Company has made in preparing the financial statements:

### Classification and measurement of investments

In classifying and measuring financial instruments held by the Company, the Company is required to make significant judgments about whether or not the business of the Company is to invest on a total return basis for the purpose of applying the fair value option for financial assets under IAS 39, Financial instruments – Recognition and Measurement ("IAS 39"). The most significant judgment made includes the determination that the Company can apply the fair value option to its investments.

### Deferred taxes

Estimates and assumptions are used primarily in the determination of the Company's deferred tax liabilities, as the income tax rates used in determining the liability are dependent on an assumption as to when a deferred tax liability is expected to be realized.

### 4. Classification of fair value measurements

The Company classifies fair value measurements using a fair value hierarchy that reflects the significance of the inputs used in making the measurements. The fair value hierarchy has the following levels:

- Quoted unadjusted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1);
- Inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly (Level 2); and
- Inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs) (Level 3).

At September 30, 2015, all of the Company's investments were Level 1 investments. There were no year-to-date transfers between Level 1 and Level 2 investments and the Company had no Level 3 investments.
